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
IMPORTANT NOTICES

Low Flying Aircraft

The P&DARCS Committee was contacted by CASA recently to follow up a complaint by a full-size aircraft flying instructor that one of our model aircraft was seen to perform a loop at 1200ft in close proximity to their aircraft. P&DARCS have in the past lodged complaints to CASA of low flying aircraft performing 'engine out' instruction over our field.

According to The Melbourne Visual Terminal Chart issued to GA aircraft, we are in the D315 area shown with a red boundary on the map.

Note the M designation signifying model aircraft club.



D315 is a Danger Area, from Surface to 7500 feet and is specified as Flying Training. West of us is the Aerobatic Area signified by the red box which should be the area used for engine out manoeuvres.

GA aircraft can fly down to 500ft over the club area and below that in the aerobatic area.

It is therefore your responsibility to avoid conflict immediately should a GA aircraft appear.





Ivan Chiselett is getting ready for the big P&DARCS Scratch & Kit Built Scale Rally On November 5th and 6th

Ivan Chiselett is getting ready for the big P&DARCS **Scratch & Kit Built Scale Rally** as he recently test flew his new scratch built model B-25 Mitchell. It was built from Ziroli plans cut by **SC Models** and is 2,57M (101") span and has a mass of 13Kgs. It is powered by two Motorolfly 3625 Electric motors with 2 X 5000mah 5 cell batteries.

The electric motors give it plenty of power and the takeoff run was less than 30M. It flies very well with no vices. It has air operated retracts with sequencing gear doors to replicate the full size aircraft as well as a rotating upper turret with machinegun noise and landing lights.

The model is of the B-25 that was flown on Australia back in the late 1980's. It was sold to the US and now resides at a museum in Chino near LA. It now wears US markings. The tiger on the side was from the sponsorship the aircraft when it was in Australia by Esso, who at that time had a tiger as its logo. Remember the Esso advert of "put a tiger in your tank". The aircraft in Chino still has the tiger on its side, (see the photo inset of the Tiger)

The decals on the model were made using photos taken of the full size at Chino when Andrew Smallridge, Paul Sommerville and Ivan went to the US in 2011. The photos were scaled then printed and then soaked in water, placed face down on a sheet of glass and the paper carefully rubbed off the photo with a finger until there is just the thin film with the photo on it. It is then let dry, cut to shape and then stuck to the side of the model. All other decals were painted.

The 2016 Classic-FAI International Challenge World Championship site Whiteman Park Perth W.A 7th - 13th May

Report by Wally Schubach

The 2016 F2 World Championships for Control Line model aircraft were held on Monday 9th May to Friday 13th may, at Whiteman Park Western Australia.

I attended this event accompanied by Peter Harris and Mark Smith.

This is the first time that these World Champs' have been held in the Southern hemisphere.

Whiteman Park is a large rectangular area, I guess about 400 acres or more, and is situated on the outer Eastern side of Perth.

An area is set aside for the W.A Model Aircraft Sports Centre, and is a purpose built facility.

There is a large shaded spectator area with seating, a play area for children, complete with a cubby house

WAMASC has been developed over many years, to cater for all forms of aeromodelling, with specific areas being allotted to Control Line, fixed wing and rotary wing models.

The fixed wing, and helicopter areas feature cemented pits, and bitumen runways.

The control line areas feature both bitumised and concrete outer circular strips for team racing and displays, with a grassed circular area for general and stunt flying

The four events held were:-

F2A - Speed

F2B - Aerobatics

F2C - Team Race

F2D - Combat

Each of these events were contested by teams from all over the World

In all 32 Countries participating, and each Country is allowed to have three entries per class, or in the Team Racing, three teams

Winners were :-


