Dear Members,

First Stage of Major Runway Upgrades

It's taken a while to get here, but the first steps in upgrading our runways took place today. After engaging the expert assistance of Graham Sullivan (from VARMS), he has put us on the path we need to be on. We are very grateful to Graham for his help to date.

For a few hours this morning, we had a John Deere Precision Cut machine carry out a demonstration on the main runway with outstanding results. This machine allows us to cut the grass to a much lower level that is needed to encourage the right grass coverage. This is the type of machinery that we need to maintain the standard on our runways that we are seeking.

Further updates as they come, but our next step is to document the project costings and further upgrade plans to our members at a general meeting.

Thanks to David Law today for his assistance in the Field Management role and to Norm Morrish for sourcing the commercial John Deere equipment for us at short notice.




Memories


Do you have pet?: No

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Crumbed Lamb Cutlets

These crumbed lamb cutlets are so crunchy and delicious. We always have them on Australia Day, and they are sensational eaten hot or cold. Enjoy.

Tips:

You could "French" the cutlets by trimming the meat that runs down the bones, but I never do. I don't want to waste any part of what have become a pretty pricey cut of meat. Also, nibbling all the crumbs and meat from the bones is the best part.

Amounts shown will feed four people. We could only manage two each as they were quite large. It just depends on how greedy you are feeling.

We enjoyed ours hot with a side of vegetables, but they are fabulous eaten cold at a picnic.





Ingredients:

8 Lamb Cutlets

Salt and pepper to taste

1 cup of panko breadcrumbs

1/2 of finely grated parmesan cheese

1/4 cup of plain flour

1 egg

Olive oil, for shallow frying

Method:

Cover each lamb chop with plastic wrap and, using a rolling pin, gently flatten meat on each cutlet

Generously season each side with salt and pepper

Combine breadcrumbs and cheese on a plate

Place flour on a plate

Whisk the egg in a shallow bowl

Coat one cutlet in flour, shaking off excess

Dip in egg

Coat in breadcrumb mixture, pressing the crumbs in

Place on a plate

Repeat with remaining cutlets, flour, egg and breadcrumb mixture

Cover with plastic wrap

Refrigerate for 20 minutes or until required

Pour oil into a large frying pan until base is covered

Heat over medium heat

Cook cutlets, in batches, for 3 minutes each side for medium or until cooked to your liking

Place on a plate lined with paper towel to drain

Sprinkle with little sea salt
